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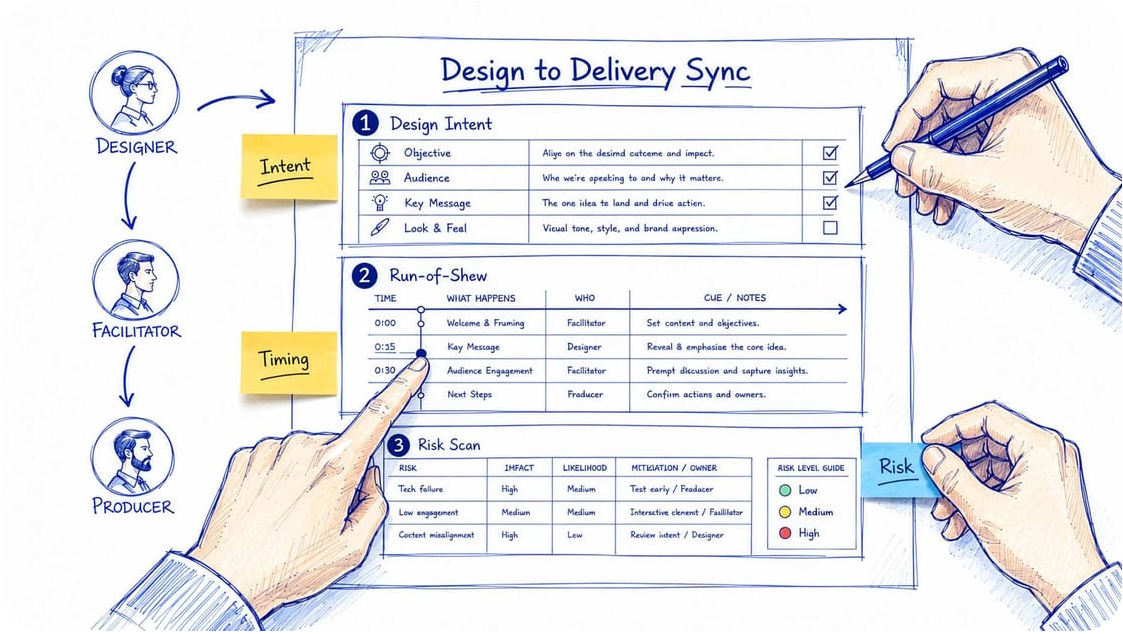
Hi Cindy,

The most frustrating delivery problems are usually the ones that looked solved before the session even began. The slides are finished, the facilitator guide is approved, and the run-of-show is in place, yet once learners arrive, small gaps start creating bigger problems. Instructions take longer to land. Activities feel uneven across cohorts. Facilitators and producers are left making real-time decisions the design should have already clarified.

This week, we're focusing on one simple but important idea, "ready" is not the same as delivery ready. Strong live learning depends on more than good content. It depends on clear handoffs, shared design intent, and workflows that help every facilitator, producer, and learner experience the program the way it was meant to work.
